


Year 2 – Autumn 1 Coastline All of the VIPERS are taught within each 2-week block:

Cross curricular links – Geography




Katie Morag and the New Pier by Mairi Hedderwick

Cross curricular links – Science and Geography


- Predict what might happen based on what has been read so far.

Cracking Comprehension / Literacy Shed Plus is used once every three weeks for a 2-day block.




The Tunnel by Anthony Browne




Man on the Moon by Simon Bartram




Beegu by Alexis Deacon
