### This week's year group news...

**Reception** As we approach the end of another thoroughly enjoyable week with your little ones, the signs of Autumn are becoming a little more evident. Next week will see the children listing and recording their understanding of the signs of Autumn. They will use pictures and emergent writing to do so. 'Fred' the frog will be busy encouraging children to start blending those sounds that they have learnt to build simple words and there will be plenty of opportunities to practise pencil grip and mark making. On Friday, part of our physical activity will include a trek to the school field to gather 'Autumn treasures' in buckets and to compete to make the biggest pile of leaves. We continue to explore matching and patterns in Maths and embracing maths skills through a range of wonderful texts. TAPESTRY will be up and running from this week so keep looking out for your children in action!

Year 1 We have had another fantastic week! We have continued our Gruffalo story writing, thinking carefully about using capital letters and full stops, going on a tricky word mouse hunt and ordering words in a sentence. We have been working hard with number work in maths, representing numbers in different ways, thinking about missing numbers in a number sequence and recalling numbers 1 more and 1 less than a given number. We have been working really hard on using some super maths talk to explain our answers. We have enjoyed our science walk, going on a tree hunt! Finding as many different leaves as we could and identifying the trees which they came from. Next week we are looking forward to our bird search! The children have really enjoyed telling us in our circle time this week about activities they like to do at home. We know last year they enjoyed using Tapestry to share their achievements outside of school. Please feel free to share photos with us and the rest of the class on Teams, anything the children are enjoying or working hard on at home. Please also remember to bring reading packets to school every day and check to see if jumpers are named. Many thanks, have a lovely weekend!

Year 2 We are really pleased with how well your children have continued to work this week! We enjoyed seeing so many families at our welcome meeting last week - if you were unable to attend the meeting, the PowerPoint presentation has been uploaded on to your child's MS Teams page. Please do not hesitate to get in contact if you have any questions. This week, we have continued to look at Rapunzel in our English lessons and have begun to plan our own version of the story. Over the next week we will be writing our own version using lots of super description. In Maths, we will be comparing and ordering two-digit numbers using the greater than and less than symbols. Thank you for all your support with reading at home. The children have enjoyed using their Rainbow book marks - don't forget that completed bookmarks will be rewarded with a certificate and entry to the termly reading raffle. We will be doing our first spelling test next week. You should have received a paper copy of the spellings and they will be posted weekly as an assignment on our MS Teams page. Your child's score will also be recorded on Teams which you will be able to view in the assignments section of Teams.











### More year group news...

Year 3 & Year 4 The Year 3 and 4 staff have been very impressed with the way children have worked hard with all of their learning this week. Next week, we have a very busy and fun filled week planned. In Maths, Year 4 will be partitioning numbers to 1000. Year 3 will identifying multiples of 10 and 100, then exploring more than and less than a number. We will all be writing our own version of 'The Diary of a Killer Cat'. The children have spent two weeks planning this and are excited to finally get their own ideas on to paper. After this, we will be editing and improving our writing. In our Science learning, we will be researching animal diets. Finally, it is 3Y's turn to visit Coombe Dean for a science trip. The remaining classes will visit in the following weeks.

Year 5 have been continuing to immerse themselves in the 'Pharaohs' topic this week. The children have been debating whether Howard Carter was an archaeologist or a tomb raider, in addition to creating a fact file about a famous Pharaoh. In English, the children have been learning how to use a thesaurus to improve their vocabulary choices and how to punctuate and use fronted adverbials to use a range of sentence openers and towards the end of the week, they used our class plan to write an historical story in the style of Secrets of a Sun King. In Maths, the children have continued their Place Value learning by ordering and comparing numbers to 1 million and counting in powers of 10. Well done and thank you to all children who completed their first My Maths homework last week. It will be set on a Friday and is expected to be completed by the following Friday. Please remember that earrings cannot be worn for PE and Games sessions, so if your child is unable to remove their earrings themselves they need to be taken out at home in the morning or your child can bring some micropore tape to cover the earrings.

Year 6 This week, the children have impressed us with their hardworking approach to assessment week. The children have completed assessments in grammar, maths and reading throughout the week. These assessments will help us, as a team, support your children throughout the year with the areas they need to focus on. Well done this week Year 6. Alongside this, the children have continued their English work linked to Antony Horowitz's 'The Switch' and have started to write their own wishing stories using this as a stimulus. They have learned how to round numbers to a given amount and have looked at how the negative number system works. In topic, the children have calculated the average heights for their class and looked at the relationship between their height and the distance they are able to throw. Next week, the children will continue to write their wishing stories and edit and improve them. In maths, they will learn about methods of calculation. Next week will also see the Head Boy and Head Girl interviews taking place so if there are any last minute applications please ensure they are passed to your class teacher.

## **School Crossing Patrol from Monday 27th September**

Plymouth City Council have asked the school to share with all parents/carer that Miss Usher, our School Crossing Patroller will start patrolling from the *unfinished* Zebra crossing on Furzehatt Road with effect from **Monday 27<sup>th</sup> September.** Please encourage your children to cross safely with the School Crossing Patrol rather than the usual crossing site opposite Holland Road. It is anticipated that the Zebra crossing will be completed and fully functional from Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> October, however this date may be subject to change.

## **Notification of Highway Maintence Works on Furzehatt Road**

We have been asked to share the following from Plymouth City Council:

Please be advised that circumstances and weather permitting, SWH will be undertaking essential highway maintenance on Furzehatt Road, on behalf of Plymouth City Council. The works will be undertaken on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> October 2021 for 1 night, between the hours of 19:00 to 06:00. Please be aware however that these dates may need to change with little or no notice.

In order to carry out these carriageway resurfacing works, a road closure will be in place between the junctions of Underlane and Dolphin Court Road. Additionally, there will be a partial closure of Goosewell Road at the junction with Furzehatt Road for junction resurfacing. This is part of the ongoing traffic safety scheme with the aim to implement strategic traffic management devices, due to safety concerns in the area.
