lullaby A quiet song that is sung to help a child sleep.

onomatopoeia The act of creating words that sound similar to the noises the words refer to, for example, buzz, pop and gurgle.
ossicles Three small bones in the middle ear.
outer ear The part of the ear, which includes the pinna and the ear canal, that collects sound waves and directs them towards the eardrum.
percussion A group of musical instruments that are played by striking them with an object or your hands, such as drums, tambourines and cymbals.
performance The act of entertaining other people by playing music, singing, dancing or acting.
pinna The visible part of the outer ear that is outside the head, and acts like a funnel, directing sounds down the ear canal.
pitch The measure of how high or low a note is.
playlist A list of songs or pieces of music.
pop A type of modern, popular music that is memorable and easy to listen to.
rock A type of popular music with a loud, strong beat that is often played with electric guitars and drums.
