HOMework AND READING

- During Term 1 your child will have:
- 5 x weekly spellings. These will be put on Microsoft Teams. We'll give you lots of fun ideas of how you can help your child to read and spell these words. They will not be tested formally. We will instead be assessing whether they are using them correctly within their writing.
- Reading daily from the RWI book or 'ditty' that they will bring home. The book will be familiar to them as it will have been taught in class. The idea is that they shouldn't struggle with it, to build reading fluency and confidence.

Reading diaries will be checked weekly on a Wednesday.

Children read daily during Read Write Inc Phonics sessions.

Your child will be heard reading 1:1 at least once a term.
