



Year Group News

Foundation Stage

Next week in Foundation Stage, our adventures with the Gingerbread Man continue. We will be creating story maps to order events in the story, writing recipes and instructions which reflect on our experience of making gingerbread this week, and weaving around a template of a gingerbread man. We are also going to be building on our number skills by using dominoes to generate adding sums to find a total. Phonics this week will explore the graphemes, igh (as in n-igh-t), ai (as in ai-n) and ee (as in p-ee-p). Keep up with events on TAPESTRY and share what your child reveals about their learning with you at home!

Year 1

Next week the children will be learning how to follow and write instructions. At the end of the week they will be completing an independent 'Big Write' on instructions. In Maths, we will be adding numbers to 100 and writing fact families e.g. $12+4=16$, $4+12=16$, $16-4=12$ and $16-12=4$. Soon the children will be making 3D Tudor houses and we would appreciate you sending your child in with a cereal box by Friday 1st February.

Year 2

Year 2 are continuing learning division and will be beginning to learn about statistics. In our Literacy lessons we will be writing an eye witness report about the Great Fire of London. 2BH will be preparing for their class assembly which is on Friday at 2.30pm in the main hall. We will continue to explore our Great Fire of London topic through art, music and computing.

Year 3

Next week is an exciting week for Year 3 as we have our Viking theme day (**Thursday 31st**). Please remember to get all your costumes ready this weekend. **In Maths** we will be focusing on adding and subtracting amounts of money. **In Writing**, we will be creating poems about our beautiful dragons and their eggs. We will also be exploring Christianity and Hinduism in RE, as well as focusing on our key skills in PE.

Year 4

After beginning our learning on discussion texts last week and thinking about balanced arguments, we will be moving on to discussing about the different sides of the argument for deforestation. The children have already formed some interesting opinions on this topic so we will have some very lively debates! Our Maths learning will move on to thinking about area where we will be using squared paper to help us find the areas of different shapes. After that, we will move on to finding the area of compound Shapes - these are shapes that are made up of smaller basic shapes. On the 7th February, we will enjoy our rainforest day and request that the children come to school in rainforest themed fancy dress; this could be an animal, an explorer or scientist.

Year 5

What's on next week in Year 5? Now we have completed multiplying and dividing whole numbers in Block 1 of Spring Term, the children will now begin looking at Fractions in White Rose's second block of Spring Term. This week, lessons will have a focus on equivalent fractions and converting mixed numbers to improper fractions and vice versa. Last week, Year 5 produced some really impressive journal writing, so following on from this, we shall continue to investigate the historic artefacts inside the tomb of Tutankhamen in more detail — will we find the missing sarcophagus? In addition, we shall hold a debate discussing who has the right to the newfound hoard of ancient treasure. Our Grammar focus next week will be using apostrophes to show contraction. As always, we shall be challenging the children to use this revised skill in their independent writing.

Year 6



In Literacy, we will be developing our journalistic writing skills to produce an assessed piece. In addition, we will be sending a team of talented rowers to Plymstock School to compete in the Primary Championships. Furthermore, a group of marvellous mathematicians will be off to Coombe Dean for the annual Maths Challenge Day.
