This week's year group news...

Reception This week we will continue our adventures with Michael as he uses his imagination to take him on a range of adventures. In Literacy we will be making Passports and writing letters to the new children about what fun they will have when they join Reception. In Maths we will be making simple totals with coins, estimating and grouping in 2's, 5's and 10's. Don't forget our virtual sports week, we look forward to seeing your sporty activities on Tapestry.....have lots fun!!

Year 1 Next week in Year 1 we will be planning a pirate party, what will you wear, eat and play? Our topic will be making pirate doubloons and a treasure chest to keep them in. Hold onto any recycling this weekend, you may need it to create these pirate items. Maths next week will be revisiting key number skills taught over the year. There will be a spelling and handwriting session and lots of opportunities to explore our pirate topic further. Hold on shipmates we have an exciting pirate week ahead. Please continue to share your child's learning on Teams or email, it only needs to be once a week of whenever you prefer.

Year 2 In Year 2 we will be looking at planning a pirate party, you will need to think carefully about what you might wear, eat and any games you may play. Maths is a mystery task based on a missing emoji, an attachment will be emailed home so you can print the booklet or it can be completed using the YouTube videos. The topic next week will be making doubloons and a treasure chest to keep them in, hold onto any junk modelling items, these will be very useful. There will be reading activities and a spelling session looking at 'a' after w and qu. Please continue to share your child's learning with their class teacher on Teams or by email.

More year group news...

Year 3 Our penultimate week in Year 3 and what a strange year it has been. This is our last week of English, Maths, SPaG and Reading - the following week your new teacher will be setting you some lessons. We will be drawing our learning about the Ancient Greeks to a close and will be thinking about what it would be like to be a Greek God. We have enjoyed reading your amazing Greek myths and seeing the adventures that your characters complete. In the final week on our unit we will be publishing our stories. In our reading lessons we will be using our VIPERS skills when looking at a modern myth - 'The Great Dog Bottom Swap'. This week in Maths we will complete arithmetic questions and we will be focussing on problem solving and looking at different types of problems - get ready to put your thinking caps on! Finally, within our SPaG lesson we will recap plural possessive apostrophes.

Year 4 Wow! What a busy term it has been for those children in school and all the children working hard completing their virtual learning! This is our final week of lessons - next week you will have some lessons from your new teacher. In Maths this week we will be completing some different problem solving challenges as well as our last arithmetic lesson. Our Myth writing will be completed this week when we publish our amazing stories - please keep adding these to MS Teams we have loved reading them so far. We will be getting creative in our final topic lesson and making our own dream catchers. Don't forget to collect your materials; a paper plate or card circle, wool or string, beads and paint. You could even find some feathers!

Year 5 The children in Year 5 continue to learn about life in Tudor times. This week, they learnt more about the tyrant, Henry VIII. In the final topic session next week, the children will be asked to imagine what rules they would put in place if they were king or queen. Watch out parents! In reading, they will learn about the life of famous Plymothian, Sir Francis Drake. There will also be a focused SPaG lesson. In maths, we have been considering the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. In future lessons, we will be focusing on co-ordinate grids and the reflection and translation of shapes. Finally, Year 5 continue to read the historical story, 'Spy Master, First Blood' and will use this to inspire their own story writing. Keep up the hard work and don't forget to post your great learning on Teams!

Year 6 This week, Year 6 continued their Gallery Rebels topic and will soon learn more about the Impressionist Movement. Taz and Annabel produced some great Brian Patten inspired art work on Teams. In reading, they have been studying literature about road safety – a great life skill in preparation for travel to Secondary School. In maths, the children have continued to apply their knowledge and skills in daily challenges. In the remaining weeks, they will be encouraged to take ownership of their own learning and revise key areas that they identify. Some suggestions for this have been put at the end of the final Sudoku video. Finally, in English, the children will continue to research the topic of electricity and carry out 'virtual' investigations for their non-chronological report. Keep up the hard work!

The SafeToNet Foundation is providing one million free-for-life licenses of the SafeToNet mobile safety App for UK families in order to help keep the nation's children safe online. The App uses artificial intelligence to safeguard children as they use their mobile device, while protecting privacy, by detecting threats such as bullying and sexting as they happen.
