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# Year Group News

### Foundation Stage

Next week in Foundation, we will be learning the sounds sh (as in sh - ee-p), th (as in th-i-n and th-i-s), ng (as in s-t -r-o-ng) and ch (as in ch-i-n). Ask us to show you our actions to go with these sounds and see if we can tell you some words that have these sounds in them. The children will each be receiving a new brown book next week which will have a few key words to learn to both read and write each week. We love seeing how quickly the children progress with the wonderful support you provide from home to reinforce their learning in class. The books will go out each Friday and please return to school when the task is complete so we can provide new words to learn. Thank you for your continued support. The children will also be designing their own Gingerbread man or woman and deciding where it will run to.... we can't wait to find out where the children decide to send them! Lidl, the park, space or it could even run to school! Keep a look out for any run away gingerbread men as we are going to be baking our own and we will definitely want to eat them!

#### Year 1

**Literacy** – Year 1 will be news reporters and writing an account of the Great Fire of London. Phonics - Continue to learn the sounds stuck in your child's homework book. **Maths** – Revision week of addition, subtraction and place value and completing White Rose Maths assessments of all their learning so far. Number Naughts! This will be the first week that your child will be tested on their first planet challenge on Wednesday. Games/PE - KS1 will be enjoying a one off Tennis workshop on Tuesday morning with a professional tennis coach.

#### Year 2

Next week in Year 2 we will be learning division by grouping in Maths. In Literacy, we will be writing instructions and we will also be learning facts about our Fire of London topic. Our learning disposition for the week will be reflecting on our learning.

#### Year 3

Year 3 will be continuing their topic on Vikings and Dragons next week. We have been reading and learning about the text 'How to Train Your Dragon' and we will be introducing a new dragon text with the children next Year 6 week! They will then be writing their own set of instructions on 'How to Hatch a Dragon Egg'. In Maths, the children will be continuing the unit on Multiplication and Division, where they will be multiplying a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number, as well as doing the same with division. They have learnt a range of methods to do this and can use visuals to support them! We will also be working on our Kodu worlds in Computing, where the children are replicating the 'Isle of Berk' from 'How to Train your Dragon', as well as singing a range of Viking songs in full Viking spirit!

#### Year 4

Year 4 have been enjoying learning about the rainforest. We have been studying orangutans and next week will begin discussing deforestation. On Tuesday, we will be completing a Big Write non chronological report about an imaginary rainforest animal. See if your child can tell you their writing target which they hope to achieve in this piece! In Maths, we have learnt how to use the short written method for multiplication and will move on to written methods for division next week.

#### Year 5

Next week in Year 5, our maths learning will be focused on division of numbers up to four digits (thousands). In Literacy, we will be continuing our cross-curricular links with our Egypt topic. There will be some surprises in store as we discover and explore King Tutankhamun's long lost tomb and the children will record their findings through the eyes of Howard Carter, an expert archaeologist, in the form of a diary entry. In addition, our Grammar focus this week will be using dashes for parenthesis; we will be challenging the children to use this new skill in their independent writing.

Year 6 continue to work very hard. Next week in Maths, we are focusing on decimal place value and will use this knowledge to order and compare numbers up to 3 decimal places. We will also be converting units of measure. In Literacy, we will be writing a newspaper report based on our Tudor-themed class read 'Spy Master'. In addition, we will be peeling back the layers of our Earth, discovering what lies beneath our feet and considering the impact of shifting tectonic plates. Don't forget that 6R have their family assembly at 2:30pm on Friday, when you can share all the great learning that is taking place with your child.

#### Dear parents and carers

Firstly, I'd like to say thank you for making me feel so welcome over the last week, it has been a pleasure getting to meet some of you outside in the playground. One of my highlights during the week is to lead the assemblies for the different key stages. The assemblies I provide are based on studying a different 'virtue' each week. The idea is that we can all be reminded of different virtues, such as determination and co-operation to help us lead better lives in and out of school.
