

Abstract Art that does not attempt to represent an accurate picture of reality but uses shapes, colours, forms and marks to achieve an effect.  acrylic paint A fast-drying water-based paint that becomes water resistant when dry.  action drawing A technique developed by Abstract artists, where paint is randomly splashed, poured or thrown onto the canvas.  Andy Warhol An American artist, famous for his Pop art printmaking. Campbell's Soup Cans are some of his most iconic pieces of work.  art movement A style of art with a common philosophy or goal, followed by a group of artists, during a period of time.  artwork Materials prepared for inclusion in a publication.  automatic drawing A technique developed by Surrealist artists that involves moving a drawing tool randomly across the paper or canvas.  Canvas A woven fabric used as backing for artwork typically stretched across a wooden frame.  charcoal A dry drawing material that can be applied to almost any surface.  Claude Monet A French Impressionist artist. Water Lilies is a series of his most iconic pieces of work.  collage Art made by sticking different materials onto a surface.	
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Cubism Art that shows its subject matter from a range of different views at the same time.  Cut-up technique A technique where text is cut up and rearranged to create new text.  Damien Hirst An English artist, famous for being a painter, conceptual and installation artist in the young British artist movement. He has won a Turner Prize for this work.  David Hockney An English artist, famous for being a painter, printmaker and photographer in the Pop art movement.  drip painting A form of Abstract art in which paint is dripped or poured onto the canvas.  easel A wooden frame for holding an artist's work while it is being drawn or painted.  Edvard Munch A Norwegian artist, famous for being a painter and graphic artist in the Expressionism movement. The Scream is one of his most iconic pieces of work.  Fauvism An art movement that flourished in 1900 that uses vivid and non-naturalistic colour.  Henri-Edmond Cross A French artist, famous for being a painter in the Pointillism movement.  Henri Matisse A French artist, famous for being a painter and sculptor in the Fauvism and Modernism movements. Woman with a Hat is one of his most iconic pieces of work.  Impressionism An art movement that captures images without detail and with an emphasis on light.	3

The Starry Night is one of his most iconic pieces of work. Wassily Kandinsky A Russian artist, famous for being a painter in the Expressionist and Abstract movements. Color Study: Squares with Concentric Circles is one of his most iconic pieces of work. watercolour Water-based paint that produces transparent colour.
