This week's year group news...

Reception The Christmas vibe hots up as we enter this penultimate week of Term 2. We will explore 'The Jolly Christmas postman' by Janet and Allan Ahlberg as our focus text. The children will have opportunities to retell the story through a story map in small world play using sequential language such as 'first, then, finally 'etc. We will be using song, dance and role-play to create further chapters in the Nativity as we build on our virtual performance for you. The children will explore making simple letters and using envelopes and stamps as well as using their best handwriting to write a message for a Christmas card. In Maths they will look at quadrilaterals- exploring similarities and differences between a range of 4 sided shapes. The children will have access to a wide range of festive themed creative activity, giving them opportunities to demonstrate the designing, joining and problem solving skills that they have already acquired. Included in these creative tasks will be one with a real sense of community spirit as they make beautiful Christmas stars for the residents of Furzehatt Care home. We are feeling twinkly as our little stars continue to shine brightly. Have a lovely weekend.

Year 1 Christmas has well and truly begun in year 1! It seems that some of the children have had some very naughty elves arrive at home and they are very eager to update us each morning with their latest escapade. Our topic continues with a look at adults who help us. In Maths, we will start to consolidate our learning for this term. A chance to go over and reinforce key learning will be useful and build confidence. We will be looking specifically at fact families and addition and subtraction by counting forwards and backwards on a number line. In English, we continue to look at instructions. The children have impressed us with how they can remember the features of instructions. They may be able to show you some of their actions that help them to remember. Friday will be Christmas jumper day with money raised going towards St.Lukes. We look forward to seeing the children arrive to school in their festive attire! We wish you all a lovely weekend.

Year 2 We have been very impressed with the children's literacy learning this week. The children have been able to recall and apply all the features of instructional writing. Using actions to remember each feature, the children have written wonderful instructions on how to brush your teeth, adding time connectives and adverbs to each step. In Maths, the children have started to learn about multiplication, looking at and identifying equal and unequal groups, completing this using concrete resources first, then completing mathematical sentences in their books. All the teachers have been very proud of each child's efforts when completing assessments in reading, maths, and phonics this week and we have seen lots of 'Gold Learning' - well done! Next week we will have the final week of our Memory Box topic and can we ask that each child bring in a small box from home so that they can design and make their own memory boxes next week? We will be moving on to money in Maths, recognising and naming coins and notes and the value of each. In literacy we will be finishing our instructions unit by following instruction on how to make a Christmas decoration and making our own, before writing instructions for someone else to follow to complete the same.

More year group news...

Year 3 This week we have done an amazing job completing our assessments to show how much we have learnt so far. All the teachers have been amazed by how sensibly and calmly the children have approached these assessments. Next week, we will be using our homework to write our own biography about a famous musician using our class example of a Bruno Mars biography as a model. We have explored the different aspects, structure, and language features of a biography over the last few weeks and are now ready to apply this within our own writing. We will be beginning our multiplication and division learning in Maths by thinking about equal groups. We will then move on to think about the 3 times table. Please remember any multiplication practice that you can do at home will be beneficial - Times Table Rock Stars in a fantastic resource for practicing at home. In our topic lessons, we will be thinking about different popular songs and will begin to write our own class song! We will also be practicing our Christmas performance which we will be recording and putting on to our YouTube channel during the last week of term.

Year 4 Next week we will become songwriters! In our topic lessons we will be looking more closely at the structure of the ear and writing a song to teach younger children how sound travels to the brain. In Maths we will be moving on to multiplication. After a quick quiz at school, it is evident that lots need to practise their tables. We are planning in some time to use TTRockstars at school, but any help or TTRockstars time that you can give them at home would be invaluable. (They need to be able to recall any calculation up to 12 x 12 within 6 seconds to pass the multiplication check in the summer.) Using these skills, the children will solve real-life problems involving a range of tables, including the inverse to divide. In literacy we will be writing our biographies for the musicians that we have chosen, making sure that we lay them out in a clear and purposeful way using subheadings, a rage of time conjunctions and chronological order. In French we will be recapping our understanding of greetings and extending our linguistic knowledge to classroom commands! Will your child beat their teacher in a game of Simon Says?

Year 5 In English this week, we have researched facts about planets within our solar system in order to write our own non-chronological reports about them. Next week, the children will be creating their own imaginary planet to write a report about, applying the language and genre features on our success criteria. Linked to our Stargazers topic, we have investigated gravity following our own lines of enquiry. The children enjoyed having permission to stand on a chair to carry out their investigations and have worked well in small groups! We would like to take the opportunity to remind you that there are 2 weeks left before the 'Topic Homework' for this term is due to be handed in on Assignments. This week, the children have embraced the challenge of assessments in Maths, Reading and Punctuation and Grammar. It has been great to see the children taking risks to answer questions which they feel less confident about and independently working through the questions. We will use the assessment information to reflect on what the children understand individually, as a class and as a year group because this helps us to identify which objectives we need to focus our attentions on.

Year 6 Wow! We have been so impressed with the children's 'rags to riches' story writing this week, using Jack London's White Fang as inspiration. Next week in English sessions, we will be creating Polar Haikus. In Maths, the children have been multiplying and dividing fractions and continuing to develop their mental arithmetic skills. Please ensure your children are completing the three to four pieces of My Maths homework each week as this consolidates their learning and improves confidence. 6R have had fun playing foot-golf and we have enjoyed finishing our busy writing week with two polar-themed art activities - Inuit prints and Northern Lights scenes. We have our second assessment week next week during which the children will sit practice SAT papers in preparation for the statutory tests in May. We hope you all have a lovely weekend.

Goosewell's School Parliament

Free School Meals

If you think your child is eligible for Free School Meals and you are not currently registered, please speak to the school office to ensure that you receive your full entitlement over the Christmas break. As a reminder:

Universal Infant Free School Meals and Free School Meals Reception, Year 1 and Year 2

All pupils in these year groups are entitled to receive a school meal at no cost as part of the Universal Infant Free School Meals grant, however, if you receive the one of the qualifying benefits for standard Free School Meals, please complete an application form as your child's school can get extra funding if you do.

At the end of Year 2

Universal Infant Free School Meals cease as your child joins Year 3 in September. All school meals will now require payment via SchoolMoney,

Whole school - Free School Meals

Families who are in receipt of any of the benefits below may also be entitled to Free School Meals. Please contact Mrs Arnold in the school office for further details. If you are in receipt of the following support payments, your child will be entitled to receive free school meals:

- Universal Credit from 1 April 2018 provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods
- Income Support (IS)
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA)
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

<u>Children</u> who receive a qualifying benefit in their own right are <u>also allowed t</u>o receive free school meals.
