This week's year group news...

Reception We are looking forward to next week as we begin to use the lovely book, 'The Rainbow Fish' by Marcus Pfister to inspire our learning. The children will be creating beautiful poetry about a fish by generating descriptive vocabulary such as glittery, shimmering, scaly etc. They will explore other poetry about the sea and talk about how the poems make them feel. Rainbows will be explored through a science investigation where the children will make simple predictions, list what they need and reflect on results as they, 'grow their own rainbow'. In Maths, we will be looking at sharing and grouping in practical contexts with the children building on their already impressive understanding of counting in sets and odds and evens. Small world and water play will see the children exploring an abundance of underwater creatures, naming and discussing their features and we will continue to enjoy our wonderful outside area in the (fingers crossed) sun!

Year 1 Muck Mess and Mixtures has got underway this week. We had a wonderful messy time investigating and making potions. We have also enjoyed a visit from the Ocean Conservation Trust. This should have happened in Term 4 during the topic The Scented Garden but had to be cancelled. We are very excited to be involved in their seagrass project. They have left us with the equipment to begin to attempt to grow seagrass which they can plant on the seabed. Fingers crossed — it's notoriously difficult to grow. We learnt how seagrass is one of the most important ecosystems on this planet, vital to the overall health of the ocean. It provides food and shelter for many different underwater creatures. It helps in coastal protection and it's a big player in the fight against climate change. In maths next week, we will be looking at comparing numbers, ordering numbers and looking at one more and one less all within 100. We are enjoying the story The Colour Monster and will be using it to learn about the features of diary writing. As always, there will be an emphasis on writing complete sentences with full stops and capital letters, adjectives and perhaps a conjunction. Next week in science we will learn all about solids and liquids before we think about the molecular structure and changes of state. Lots to do and lots of fun! Have a lovely weekend everyone.

Primary Academy

Year 2 Welcome back to an exciting Term 6 with Muck, Mess and Mixtures. We started our topic with and explosion of fun as year 2 witches and wizards descended onto the school field and performed various spells and explosions. We had a wonderful time! Next week in English we will continue to write based on the story 'The Day the Crayons Quit' by Drew Dawalt. The children will choose another classroom object to transform into a character who is not happy in their role! It is going to be funny. Phonics fun will continue as normal and the reading group have embarked on the text George's Marvellous Medicine by Roald Dahl which they are thoroughly enjoying, especially all the ghastly bits! In Maths we will complete our block on Division focusing on odd and even numbers and dividing by 5 and 10. In RE will be learning about the religion of Islam and colour mixing in Art. More year group news...

Year 3 & Year 4 The Year 3 and 4 children all deserve a huge 'WELL DONE' for your commitment to your learning this week. Next week, we are continuing to read the Native American tale 'Ahaiyute and Cloud Eater' written by Vladimir Hulpach and illustrated by Marek Zawadzki. In writing we will be finding out who Rosa Parks is and finding out about her life. We will then be writing a diary entry based on events in her life. Y3 Mathematicians will investigate 2D shapes and right angles. Year 4 Mathematicians will be consolidating their learning about fractions. And finally, in our Topic sessions children will be exploring the USA and using maps, atlases and Google Earth to locate key landmarks and states.

Year 5 Year 5 have got 'off' to a flying start with our new topic 'Off With Her Head'. The children seem extremely excited to learn about the history of the Tudors and we have started by creating a timeline of key events that happened from 1485 – 1603. In our Reading sessions, we have started to read Macbeth, written by the famous playwright Shakespeare, who was born during the Tudor reign. The children have fully engaged with this text and have been looking in depth at the vocabulary that has been used and the effect that these words have on the reader. Our English model text for this term also links to our topic; Spy Master will be used as a model for our own stories, which will see a young peasant become a trusted spy for Henry VIII. You will also have noticed that the spellings to learn for this week were all linked to this topic too – what a lovely way to start the final term in Year 5. In Maths, we have been learning about angles and learning how to identify the different types of angles. Can your child tell you the names and properties of these angles? Last term, we were disappointed by the number of homework tasks that were uploaded to Microsoft Teams. Those children who did complete their homework, had put a great deal of effort into their outcomes and for that, we thank you. In readiness for Year 6, we would really like to see an outcome uploaded by every child by the end of this term. Your child's log in details for Teams were emailed to you at the end of April.

Year 6 this week, we have been practising the group songs for our upcoming production 'School of Rock'. Please continue to learn these at home and any lines you may have as a cast member. Rehearsals will start in earnest next week! We were also visited by Plymstock School and the children were able to ask questions in preparation for transition. In English sessions, we have watched the chilling short film 'Alma' and used this as inspiration for our own writing. We have focused on the use of figurative language and micro-expressions to describe characters, settings and create mood and atmosphere for our reader. The children will be writing their own horror story next week. Our Maths learning this week has focused on consolidation of learning in preparation for assessment week. The children have been considering powers of ten and how this can aid them when calculating. Weekly spelling tests are still taking place each Friday so please ensure that the spelling lists are accessed via the website (Term 4 -5). Finally, please look out for information regarding the Year 6 activity day in July, as an email about food choices has been sent out. Thank you for your continued support and stay safe.

The group is suitable for mums with a shild under 2 year



LFT testing is designed to identify asymptomatic cases only.
