We have been blown away by the enthusiasm and hard work the children have shown us, we are very impressed with their story writing. We have moved on to number and place value in Maths, revising numbers 1-10, thinking about their value, place on a number line, using part part whole models to build the number and spelling the numeral names. In topic we have continued to learn about the Great fire of London, representing the activity through collage. In Maths, we will be focussing further on length and perimeter and in Writing, we will be starting our new Historical Fiction block based all around the events in Pompeii that the children have also learnt about within Geography. Year 4 In literacy this week, we have seen the children displaying their amazing pen licence skills! If your child doesn't have one yet, try practising those tall letters and joins over the half term break as we will be handing more out shortly. Our literacy focus this week has highlighted the passion that pupils have about the environment and helped them to understand ways we can improve our impact- we'd love to hear if they've been doing anything at home related to this. After half term, we will be learning more about adventure stories and exploring our text 'King of the Cloud Forests' by Michael Morpurgo in more detail. Our World Book Day experience will be based on this and we will be exploring the exotic far Eastern settings in the book. In maths, we will be focusing on understanding tenths and hundredths, before moving onto recognising these fractions presented in different ways. In topic, children will be further extending their knowledge of the water cycle and understanding the process of condensation and evaporation in this process. In art, children will continue their animal project and print some patterns based on animal markings.

Year 5 This week, Year 5 have published leaflets designed to persuade staff to eat healthily – will they have tempted lots of teachers to whip up a refreshing smoothie or a veg-packed dinner over half term?! In Maths, we have moved on to performing addition and subtraction calculations with fractions. For Children's Mental Health Week, we had a visit from Tanya Stilwell who discussed lots of great ideas to support good mental health habits, including daily exercise, drawing, mindfulness breathing activities, socialising and talking with friends and family. We were very impressed with the great ideas the children shared during the session and will continue to encourage and share these ideas around school. In Art, we have produced some beautiful ink drawings as part of our Line, Light and Shadow mini topic – this was a new medium for lots of children, but they rose to the challenge of creating different tones with diluted ink washes and experimenting with lines and mark making using calligraphy pens.




This week's highlights & reminders: Parent Support Advisor - Jo Penk

Read Write Inc

To all families with children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2,

I just wanted to share with you how extremely pleased we are with the children's progress in their phonics again this term. We assessed the children last week and the vast majority have moved up a group. This is a wonderful achievement. A huge well done to all involved at home and at school.

To continue on this amazing journey, we need your full support in helping the children read and share their books at home daily as well as reminding them to bring their RWI packs on the correct days. They will not be given their next book until their previous one is returned. Please remember that we ask our children to read each book three times to encourage and build confidence and fluency.

We ask that any school books that you may have lying around at home be sent in asap and that you really try to take care of our school books and the packets that the children bring their books home in. I know these packets are quite flimsy but we cannot keep replacing them. If they rip, please fix them with tape.

If your child is at home isolating or you are just keen to help them improve their phonic knowledge, please remember our Goosewell YouTube channel has phonic lessons for all of the RWI group colours. If your child is in the A/B or Ditty group, they would need to look at Red groups films. Ruth Miskin's website is also helpful at explaining how we teach phonics and how we pronounce the sounds accurately.

Don't forget to use our wonderful local library. It's a great place for children to borrow a range of exciting books. Pop along and see what's going on over the half term break. You can always grab a cuppa and a treat whilst you're there!
