## This week's year group news...

**Reception** This final week before the Easter break will be a week of consolidation. The children will complete their fantastic retellings of 'Jasper's Beanstalk' where they have demonstrated a knowledge of days of the week, comparison of length and beautiful letter and number formation as well as the ability to retell a story. They will also write a message for an Easter card which they have been making. The text, 'Whatever Next' by Jill Murphy will inspire child initiated learning with the children thinking imaginatively and creatively about what a box could turn into as well as learning about owls and their life cycles and habitats. Maths will see the children using 2D shapes to create a space picture with planets and rockets in addition to consolidating their knowledge of and interest in numbers within 10. The children will be perfecting their already impressive reading and writing skills in their phonics groups. Have a wonderful Easter break everyone.

Year 1 As we begin to come to the end of our current topic, 'The Scented Garden', we prepare to move into the next term with our new topic, 'Wiggle and Crawl'. The new topic follows perfectly from our current one as we look more closely at the minibeasts that live in our environment. There will be plenty of opportunities for some fun science investigations and nature enthusiasts will be in their element! Next week, we will base our writing around a fun story about the Easter bunny. In maths, we will be consolidating our learning form this term with a focus on addition and subtraction. The children are well in the flow of being back at school now and we are sure a break will do them good. Thank you for all your support. We wish you a restful and fun Easter break, hopefully with lots of chocolatey treats to enjoy!

Year 2 Well done Year 2 on a happy and productive return to 'proper' school! Only three days to go now and we have lots of fun planned. Next week, we will be moving on from our exotic plant fact files to invent our own crazy plant. The crazier the better! Spellings will be set on assignments each week. The usual 5 and some additional topic themed words. Some children will be using rainbow spelling packs instead which you will be informed about. Watch out for your pack coming home. In Maths we will be focussing on Easter themed activities to consolidate our learning. We have been making special pottery thank yous for our wonderful key workers which has been funded through Rotary Saltram. This week we will decorate them and add a little sparkle! More information will follow. Maths themed Easter egg hunts and Easter RE will fill our last week. Thank you for your continued support. Mrs Kimberlee and Mrs Boalch?











## More year group news...

Year 3 & Year 4 Thank you for all your hard work Year 3 and 4. We have had such a busy week and our stories are looking amazing! Literacy in Years 3 and 4 will be influenced by the approaching holidays — we will be focusing on the Easter Story. The children will review an age related version of the text and ensure they know the religious aspects as well as the Literacy skills found within the story. They will also be given an opportunity to show off their acting skills as we have a look at a play script version of the story. However, the main thrust of the sessions in this mini-block prior to our Easter break will be how to write diary entries. The children will be tasked with considering what a witness would see in the events surrounding the Easter story and be able to empathise with that character. Having considered what has been seen and felt by that character, they will create a diary entry for a most memorable day! Year 3 Maths — children will be investigating length and perimeter. Year 4 Maths — children will continue investigating decimals. They will be representing hundredths on a place value grid and then move onto dividing 1 and 2 digit numbers by 100. For topic, we will be planning a mountaineering trip and researching the life of the Adi tribe who live in the Himalayan Mountains.

Year 5 As we approach the end of our Beast Creator topic, the children in Year 5 have continued to be fascinated by the minibeasts, which we have been learning about. In our Spelling session this week, we learnt the definitions of key vocabulary linked to the topic and in Reading we finished using the 'Super Bug' text to retrieve information about what we had read in addition to distinguishing between facts and opinions. The children are enjoying writing their own fact files about a minibeast of their choice and are getting creative as they use recycling materials to make a 3D model of a minibeast. We aim to finish reading our class text 'Charlotte's Web' in readiness for making comparisons between the book and the film on the last day of term. In Maths, we have been learning how to subtract fractions. Being able to recall multiplication facts at speed is an essential skill to be able to find common denominators etc. Please encourage your child to play multiplication games or fire some questions at them to improve their confidence and accuracy in this area. Next term, our topic is called 'Allotment'. Further information about this topic will be sent home at the start of next term. In the meantime, we would like to wish you all a Happy Easter and hope that you enjoy being able to meet up with a few more friends and relatives over the holiday.

Year 6 In Year 6 this week, the children have been learning about the Mayan religion. Next week, we will conclude our learning about Mexico by considering their ancient use of hieroglyphics. The Maya created a written language to communicate. They had about 800 symbols. Archaeologists have figured out what many of the symbols mean, but not all of them. Some glyphs were used as numbers. Some were used as sounds. Some were phrases or words. To read Maya glyphs, you read downward, left to right, in pairs. In English sessions, we have been using images of Mexico and our topic learning to inspire us to write some terrific free verse poetry. In our reading sessions, the children have continued to apply their viper skills when reading and discussing the mysterious storybook 'Tuesday' by David Wiesner. Please ensure that your child has an appropriate reading book and is quizzing regularly. Our maths learning this week has focused on ratio and proportion, leading to the use of scale factors in future sessions. MyMaths homework tasks have been set to reinforce classroom learning. Please make sure that all children with a pen licence, bring their own handwriting pen to school. Finally, weekly spelling tests are taking place each Friday so please ensure that the spelling lists are accessed via the website or Teams assignments.

I just wanted to share with you how pleased we are in Reception, Years One and Two with the children's progress in their phonics. We assessed the children last week and the vast majority have either stayed where they were prior to lock down or moved up a group. This is a wonderful achievement and all credit to our wonderful families supporting our children so well in their home learning.

To continue on this amazing journey, we need your full support in helping them read and share their ditty sheets or books at home daily as well as reminding them to bring their RWI packs on the correct days.
