Year Group News

Foundation Stage

Next week our learning is going to be based around the story Handa's Surprise. We are going to be tasting and drawing different fruits and the children will be writing a retell of the story. Outside the children will be setting up their own fruit and vegetable shop in our Rainbow Den and we will be using coins and making paper bags. We will also be experimenting with weaving with different materials. Keep an eye on Tapestry to see what exciting things we are doing.

Year 1

Next week in Year 1, the children will be continuing their African journey through the reading and writing of elephant inspired poems. They will be using their knowledge of African animals to write their own riddles, using descriptive clues to help their friends guess which animals they have written about. In maths, the children will be revisiting money where they will be improving their skills on both recognising coins and making amounts. The children will also be designing and making their own pop-up African animal puppets in Design and Technology this week.

Year 2

This week in Year 2 we are investigating and problem solving numbers to 100 during our maths sessions. We are finding out about how to recycle plastics in our reading sessions and will be composing acrostic poems based on Africa. During our art sessions we will be looking at tribal jewellery and shields and replicating our own versions. We are continuing to explore African drumming and dancing and are enjoying listening to African beats and rhythms.

Year 3

Next week Year 3 will be exploring measurement with a focus on capacity and mass (weight). We will continue to explore the lives of the Ancient Greeks and create a non-fiction information poster. In computing we will add more pages to our Science Power Point presentation. We are looking forward to our Sports Day on Friday 28th.

Year 4

Next week, in Literacy, the children will continue to use the book 'The London Eye Mystery' as a stimulus for writing a newspaper report. They will begin by developing their understanding of the features of newspaper writing and then plan and write their own articles focused on the disappearance of a child in London. In Maths, Year 4 will be focusing on statistics. They will be collecting data and presenting it in bar charts and pictograms. In Science, the children will begin to investigate the processes involved when changes of state occur initially focusing on heating and cooling and the effect of this.

Year 5

In Year 5 next week we will finish our work on Michael Morpurgo's Friend or Foe, this time planning and writing an alternative ending to the story. In Maths, we will convert between different units of metric measure (for example, km and m; cm and m; cm and mm; g and kg; l and ml). In addition, we will be practising our dances and songs in preparation for World War Two Day, which takes place later this term.

Year 6

Next week, we will be practising very hard for our end of year production and continuing to study The Stone Age. The children are now researching an aspect of our topic for their own project. We are also designing a theme park on a budget in Maths and launching a new cereal brand. Watch out Lord Sugar! Please remember that we need costumes in by 28th June in a named carrier bag and remember to send in your ticket requests as space is limited!
