Year Group News

Foundation Stage

We have had a lovely week at school, playing and learning happily together. Next week, we will be using the story of 'The Stick Man' by Julia Donaldson to inspire our learning. We will be creating our own Stick men and families, and talking lots about our own families and how special they are to us. Phonics will see us continuing with the 'Read Write inc' programme and learning how to read, write and say the sounds i,n,p,g and o. We will review our understanding of the numbers 0,1,2 and 3 and introduce 4. If you are out and about over the weekend it would be wonderful if you could spot and collect 'Autumn treasures' for your children to bring into school and chat about. Enjoy the Autumn sunshine!

Year 1

Next week in Year 1 we will be continuing our work on 'The Gruffalo'. Children now know the story really well and are ready to start thinking of their own character to put into it. They will be writing character descriptions about their new character. In Maths, children will be counting forwards, backwards and finding one more/one less than a number. We will be dissecting plants and flowers in Science and learning the names of the different parts. Please make sure your child has suitable shoes for outdoor PE in school.

Year 2

Next week in Year 2 we are really looking forward to our bikeability sessions at the beginning of the week. This will be a great opportunity for the children to develop and learn new biking skills with their friends in the sunshine. We are continuing our learning about the Gruffalo in Literacy and the children will be rewriting their own versions of this classic story. Our maths learning is all about numbers and how they are made. We will be counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and partitioning 2 digit numbers with apparatus. We are exploring our school field in our science sessions and will be looking at and identifying British trees and plants.

Year 3

This week we have enjoyed writing a class version of The Wind in the Willows using all our fantastic vocabulary. We are excited about writing individual versions next week. We have been continuing out place value learning in Maths we are very confident in using manipulatives to represent different numbers up to 1000. As part of our 'Flow' we have begun to identify the features of a river and have had a go at creating our own river features.

Year 4

After a week of planning our own adventure stories, we will be writing our swashbuckling tales and publishing them in our neatest handwriting for display. In maths we will be counting and comparing numbers up to 10,000, and in our topic learning we will be looking at how scientists have discovered the creatures lurking in the depths of the ocean. If there are any submariner/diver/scientist parents who have experiences of the deep sea they would like to share with Year 4, please let your child's teacher know - we would love to hear from you!

Year 5

Year 5 have been continuing to immerse themselves in the 'Pharaohs' topic this week. The children have been sketching artefacts, which were discovered inside Tutankhamun's tomb, in addition to creating timelines of the key events that occurred during Ancient Egyptian times. In English, the children have been learning how to write relative clauses and how to use brackets for parenthesis. Can your child explain these terms to you with an example? In Maths, the children have continued their Place Value learning by rounding to 10, 100 and 1000 as well as reading and representing numbers in various ways. During PE this week, we have been developing our throwing and catching skills by playing 'Throw Tennis'. Please remember that earrings cannot be worn for PE and Games sessions, so if your child is unable to remove their earrings themselves they need to be taken out at home in the morning or your child can bring some micropore tape to cover the earrings.

Year 6

Next week, Year 6 will write their suspense stories based on Antony Horowitz 'The Switch'. At the end of the week, they will be able to edit and improve their writing and share it with other Year 6 children. In maths, they will begin to develop their understanding of addition and subtraction. Our ID learning, will see the children begin to take part in a design and technology project where they will design a bag personal to them. They will also start to design their own avatars thinking about what makes them unique.
