As communicated to all families last month, the new Goosewell Primary Academy uniform will be introduced from September 2020 should you need to renew any of your child's uniform, with the intention that all children will wear the new style uniform from September 2021. Delivery to your home/work address takes approximately 10 working days, but please be aware that this is likely to increase during the busy summer period. Firstly, thank you for your time in completing the parent RSE survey. This has contributed to your children's surveys and our local area research study to develop a Relationships Education Curriculum that is bespoke to Goosewell and your children's needs.

The results highlighted the following key areas of need specific teaching in the following areas:

### Devon Flu Vaccination Programme 2020/21 - IMPORTANT

Dear Parents/Carers,

If your child is due to be in Reception to Year 6 from September 2020, they are eligible for a Free Nasal Childhood Flu Vaccination.

It is anticipated that this will be delivered in schools between October 2020 to December 2020, this will be administered adhering to all up to date Infection Control, PPE and social distancing guidance at the time.

Flu vaccination is one of most effective interventions we have to reduce pressure on the health and social care system which is going to be more important than ever this year. For this reason, it is essential we deliver the vaccine to as many children as possible to prevent the spread of infection to those most at risk in society.

### Goodbye 4H from Miss Hingston

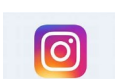
