

This week's year group news...

Reception Our learning about plants and Spring will take on a more scientific vibe in the coming week as we use the beautifully illustrated book, 'The Tiny Seed' by Eric Carle to enhance our learning. The children will explore further the life cycle of a seed, looking at how plants reproduce and what happens season to season. They will label simple diagrams about the parts of a plant and demonstrate their knowledge of how plants grow. They will also examine and draw a range of different seeds, describing them and comparing similarities and differences. Their writing task this week will involve them writing as though they are the seed and documenting the seed's journey through the year. In Maths, the children will be exploring length using skills of comparison and estimation. They will also explore pattern with a focus on pattern in the natural world. We will be encouraging children to keep an eye on their beans, documenting their progress and caring for them effectively.

Year 1 In Year 1 this week we were excited to have a visitor who came in to tell us all about Judaism and to explain some of the important events in the Jewish calendar. We have enjoyed learning about the Jewish religion in class, so we were keen to hear more interesting facts. In Maths we have been exploring the difference between odd numbers and even numbers to ten. We have been spotting odd and even numbers around the school, so perhaps the children can spot some at home. In English we are continuing our non-fiction unit, writing informative texts containing interesting facts about famous London landmarks. Ask us how many steps there are inside the Elizabeth Tower!

And our topic work lands in the next county down from us as we focus on a case study of a river settlement and habitat in Somerset.

Year 5 We were so impressed with the costumes worn by the children for World Book Day last week and wish to thank you for supporting your child to enjoy this event. We spent the afternoon being thoroughly entertained by a storyteller called Malou, and we can see how inspired the children were by their retelling of our model text Charlotte's Web. In Reading, we have been discussing our favourite recipes and creating adverts to persuade children to buy the book. We would like to make you aware that our Religious Education lessons for this term link to the overarching question 'How does faith help people when life gets hard?' As part of these lessons, we will be identifying beliefs about life after death in at least two religions and the children will have the opportunity to share their own opinions about what they believe happens when someone dies. Please get in touch with your child's class teacher if you feel these discussions could be emotional for your child so that we can support them. In Maths, we have been multiplying unit and non-unit fractions in addition to mixed number fractions.

The children have embraced the challenge of algebra and have been able to solve problems by calculating the numerical values of letters and symbols using their number knowledge and inverse operations. We have continued to use the CGP books to revise key concepts in SPaG, reading and maths and many children have continued to benefit from attending our Early Bird Club. In PE, we have started a gymnastics block; our first session focused on balancing and partner work and the children approached this very sensibly. The drizzle didn't stop us enjoying our outdoor games slot on Wednesday; each class focused on a different invasion game. Thank you to those who attended parent consultations; it was a pleasure to report on the children's progress as well as their learning attitudes and how they are developing as individuals to become secondary-ready.
