	The items that have been grown or obtained through farming, such as eggs, bacon, honey and vegetables.
	<b>propagate</b> To produce a new plant from a cutting of a parent plant.
	<b>propagator</b> A covered container, filled with earth or compost, that is used to help seeds germinate and grow.
,	<b>rhizome</b> A horizontal stem of some plants that grows underground, producing shoots above the surface and roots below.
	<b>sapling</b> A young tree.
	seasonal food Food types that are only harvested at a certain time of year, such as asparagus in spring and apples in autumn.
	<b>seed</b> A small object produced by a plant following fertilisation, that a new plant can grow from when planted.
	<b>stamen</b> The male part of a flower that contains an anther and a filament.
	<b>stigma</b> A female part of a flower which receives pollen.
	<b>style</b> A female part of a flower that joins the stigma to the ovary.
