This week's year group news...

Reception It has been an amazing first week for your little ones and you should all feel extremely proud of them. They have settled so happily and quickly to new routines and new faces. We would like to thank you for being so fantastic at remembering different timings, different entrances and exits and all of the new routines brought by these unusual times. Next week we will be embracing the oncoming season of Autumn and talking about changes that we might see in our environment. We will be introducing our first 'Read Write Inc' sounds - m, a, s, d and t in phonics and looking at number 1 in terms of formation, counting, matching 1:1 and real-life contexts.

Thank you for filling in your permission slips for TAPESTRY which is being set up as we speak. Can we please take this opportunity to remind you to ensure that your child's name is on any clothing or items that they bring into school. Many thanks and enjoy your weekends with your children. I imagine that they will be very sleepy!

Year 1 Hello new year 1 parents! Firstly, thank you for all your support settling into our first week back. We are so proud of how well everyone has returned to school and taken all the changes in their stride. We have had a very busy week exploring our new classrooms, getting used to new routines and meeting all the new adults working with us. We also managed to make time for a Queen's tea party.

Next week will be just as busy, still getting used to all the new routines, activities and expectations. But, in Maths, we will also be practicing counting forwards and backwards, starting at different numbers. In English we will be reading 'The Queen's Hat' and completing lots of challenges based on this story.

For our second week of the new term, Year 2 children will be labelling a map of the UK finding the capital cities the countries and creating a key. In maths, the children are continuing to review the Year 1 number knowledge. The children have enjoyed reading our writing text 'Katie in London' and we are now ready to create their own story maps. More year group news...

Year 3 Welcome back to our brand new Year 3! We have loved having you all back in school this week and have been impressed by how well you have all settled back in to school and your learning. Well done! We have enjoyed completing lots of PSHE sessions this week as well as starting our topic learning. Next week, we will continue to look at Treasure Island in our English lessons and will begin to explore the story further to create our own class version. This will also be the text that we are reading at 3 o'clock. We will be focussing on place value in our Maths lessons and thinking about the value of each digit within a number. This term our topic is The Blue Abyss and we will begin to explore the creatures that live in the oceans around the world and the layers that make up our oceans.

Year 4 A huge welcome back to year 4 who have impressed us with the way they have settled back to school after six months off! This term we will be learning about the Blue Abyss, starting with considering the needs of living creatures in order to raise our very own brine shrimp! We will also be studying food chains within the ocean and considering what would happen if any of the creatures became extinct. In maths, we will recap some Year 3 objectives, representing numbers to 1000 in various ways and looking closely at place value before moving on to placing numbers to 1000 along a blank number line. Continuing with our reading text 'One World,' we will be answering retrieval questions, exploring the deeper meaning behind the author's words and thinking about how we can use his message to make the world a better place. In literacy, we will use our Treasure Island text to explore writing in paragraphs, expanded noun phrases and describing a setting in detail before we plan our very own swashbuckling adventure!

Year 5 We are really pleased with how well your children have settled into Year 5! It has been lovely to hear them playing and chatting as they rekindle their friendships in addition to making new ones. The children are all looking very smart in their uniform and they have certainly spoken positively about being back at school. We have introduced our 'Pharaohs' topic by locating Egypt and its significant landmarks on a map. Our first reading text links to this topic and the children are certainly hooked by the plot of 'Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx'. Next week in English, we will be planning a class story linked to our model text 'Secrets of a Sun King' and in Maths we will be continuing our learning about the place value of numbers, working with numbers within 10,000. Your child should have brought home an Accelerated Reader book, which we would like them to read daily in readiness for completing their first quiz.

Year 6 We have been very impressed with how the Year 6 children have returned to school with big smiles and positive attitudes towards their learning. This week, the children have been introduced to our English text 'The Switch' and our Reading text 'The Lonely Sea Dragon'. In Maths, we have begun a block on Place Value, using various practical representations of numbers up to 10,000,000. The children have been enthusiastic about our 'Identity' topic and have thought about their own qualities and characteristics. Next week, we will continue the above units of learning. We will plan our own stories based on 'The Switch', find out what happens to the sea dragon in Reading sessions and focus on the communities the children belong to. Year 6 will have Games on a Wednesday and will need to wear their kits to school. Please make sure your child has a pen in school because we will start looking to award pen licences next week. Homework and weekly spellings will be set from Monday via the Microsoft Teams 'Assignments' facility. Children will be shown how to use this in class and will be told their log on details. Their password is unique to them so they must keep this private. Please encourage your child to read regularly and take Accelerated Reader quizzes at home. Let's see who the first Year 6 'Millionaire' is going to be! You should have received a text about Bikeability which is planned to take place during the week commencing 12th October. This is always a fantastic opportunity for children of all abilities. More details to follow! Have a fantastic weekend everyone!

Devon Flu Vaccination Programme 2020/21 - IMPORTANT

Dear Parents/Carers,

Your Reception to Year 6 child, they are eligible for a Free Nasal Childhood Flu Vaccination.

It is anticipated that this will be delivered in schools between October 2020 to December 2020, this will be administered adhering to all up to date Infection Control, PPE and social distancing guidance at the time.

Flu vaccination is one of most effective interventions we have to reduce pressure on the health and social care system which is going to be more important than ever this year. For this reason, it is essential we deliver the vaccine to as many children as possible to prevent the spread of infection to those most at risk in society.
