This week's year group news...

Reception Has it really only been 4 weeks? We already feel that we know your little ones so well and they are demonstrating the independence and the ownership of their learning experiences that we love to see. Hopefully they are chatting to you at home about 'Fred talk' and how to form letters and numbers. Next week continues with an exploration of this lovely season with the introduction of the book, 'The Scarecrow's Wedding' by Julia Donaldson. We will talk about Harvest and the children will have the opportunity to explore Autumn fruit and vegetables like pumpkins, squash and pomegranate. They will use tweezers to pluck out and examine the seeds as well as observational skills to draw them. They will be invited to select and join a range of resources to create their own play dough scarecrow as well as developing their cutting skills to cut straight and curved lines. Phonics moves on to e, I, h, r and j and our number of the week is 4. In their orange books, the children will use the book, 'Oi frog' as a stimulus to find rhyming words to create funny sentences about animals. Did you know that 'lions sit on irons'? Thanks for your wonderful response to our Foundation five home activities and your continued support. Have a great weekend, albeit in the rain!

Year 1 Well what a busy week we have all had. Thank you all for supporting our Harvest celebrations with an overwhelming amount of donated goods. We hope your children are coming home talking about Chimp challenges - they certainly all love one! Next week, our London tour bus completes its final tour and all passengers are asked to disembark as we make way for a fire station! Some of the children have already told us that they know something about a 'Great Fire of London' so hopefully everyone will be interested to learn more about this event. Our literacy learning will link to this theme as we talk and write about fire safety and complete fact cards. In Maths, we are looking at ordinal numbers -1st, 2nd, 3rd etc and continue to build confidence in understanding order and place value on the number line. We hope everyone is enjoying year one. It is our upmost priority that children are happy as happy children make the best learners. No doubt some tiredness will start kicking in as we enter week 5. Enjoy your weekend everyone ?

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Year 2 We have had another busy week in Year 2, consolidating our place value learning in Maths using tens and ones to add and find maths 'families'. We have also been writing captions and labels for London landmarks as part of our non-fiction writing unit and creating beautifully painted London street scenes in order to make our own moving vehicle to 'slide' along the roads. Next week, our topic will be moving into the historical event of 'The Great Fire of London'. The children will be learning how the fire started, why it spread so quickly and how London was then rebuilt differently as a result. In English, the children will spend next week researching and find out facts about three of their chosen London Landmarks to help them write their own guides the following week. In maths, the children will be comparing numbers and learning to count confidently in 2s, 5s and 10s. We would also like to say a huge thank you to all the families that have contributed to Plymouth Foodbank this week, your donations have been gratefully received and we thank everyone for their generosity in these difficult times.









More year group news...

Year 3 This week we had a fantastic online talk from Coral, one of the Rangers from Wembury Marine Centre. We loved learning all about the different parts of the ocean and the creatures that live there. We also created and asked her our own questions. We were very impressed as she was able to answer nearly all of them! We found out loads of new facts. Next week we are continuing our exploration into the negative effects of fishing and will be looking at the effect the crown of thorn starfish is having on the coral reefs when their natural predators have been removed through overfishing. In our Maths lessons we will be bringing our place value learning to a close by thinking about ordering numbers, counting in 50s and placing numbers on a number line. We will be continuing to read 'The Snorgh and The Sailor' in our reading lessons and we are looking forward to finding out what happens when the Snorgh uses his bath as a boat. We will also be using our inference skills to think about how the characters are feeling at different points in the story. Thank you for your support with spellings we are really pleased with how everyone has been learning their spellings each week. Can we take this opportunity to remind you that children should be reading daily - they are told by their teacher to take their reading book home each day. This should then return with them each morning.

Year 4 In English, Year 4 will develop their skills involved in creating play scripts. They will use their understanding of 'overfishing' which is destroying delicate food webs and write an interesting 'live discussion'. Year 4 will continue to use their place value skills, this time to mentally calculate 10, 100 and 1000 more or less. The expectation will be that the children become more efficient and confident with their mental agility in this area of number. We will then move onto comparing and ordering 4-digit numbers. In topic work, our intrepid ocean explorers will consider how we as humans are causing environments to change and so threaten living things that exist there. They will also become very artistic by becoming inspired by their sketches and drawings of ocean creatures and creating their very own clay sea anemone! So much to do in only one week! Remember - keep up the hard work on your Accelerated Reader quizzes. Your teacher will be checking your word count very soon and will be looking to reward those book worms out there! Keep on reading...

Year 5 In English this week, we have been reading lots of newspapers because the children are going to become journalists and write articles about the death of Tutankhamun. They enjoyed having some time to read 'First News', a children's newspaper we have in the library, and have started to compile a list of the features which they will need to include in their own writing. We have started our second reading text this week 'The Scarab's Secret', which has provided the children with opportunities to develop their vocabulary and to retrieve facts from non-fiction about the scarab beetle. Our place value learning in Maths has progressed to negative numbers and roman numerals. Your child may well have been asking you for some tin foil and kitchen roll so that they can make their own mummy as this is an activity they have enjoyed linked to our Pharaohs topic. Please remember that if you are unable to find the weekly spellings on Teams, they can also be found on the Year 5 page of the website. Thank you for your continued support.

Year 6 The Year 6 children have been busy learning about the features of autobiographies. Thank you for supporting them in preparing notes for homework; these have enabled the children to make a great start in writing about their early childhoods. In Maths, we have worked on short and long multiplication as well as mental methods. In our ID topic, we have been thinking about what it means to be part of a group and we've created abstract portraits of ourselves. In IT, we have created our own Avatars. Please make sure you have completed the Bikeability consent form online by Monday 5th October. If we have not received consent, unfortunately your child will not be able to take part. Appointments for Doctor Bike are now closed. Next week, we will continue our autobiographical writing and focus on key arithmetic skills. Please look out for a letter from us next week requesting a piece of old fabric or clothing for our DT learning in a few weeks.

As a continuous cough (as set out in the image) is a symptom of Covid-19 it is vital that any household member who displays these symptoms self isolates and books a test.

A NEW CONTINUOUS COUGH MEANS:

 you are coughing a lot for more than 1 hour



OR

- you have been coughing a lot 3 or more times in 24 hours

- if you normally have a cough, it may be worse than usual.
