# This week's year group news...

**Reception** The last week of term in Reception will find us feeling festive and full of fun. We will complete our Christmas cards for our families, showing off our best handwriting as well as cutting triangles to create Christmas trees. We will explore using a flange to create an angel in junk modelling as well as selecting resources to design and decorate Christmas baubles and jumpers. There will be opportunities to consolidate our understanding of numbers to 5 as we create a festive themed number story book and we will continue to explore applying our phonics in writing letters and messages to Santa, his elves and the characters from ,'The Jolly Christmas Postman'. May we take this opportunity to thank you wholeheartedly for your support and involvement in your child's learning journey so far. Fingers crossed that 2021 will bring us joy and positivity.

**Year 1** We have been very busy swiftly putting together a small Christmas production for you to enjoy on YouTube next week. The children have all been absolutely brilliant in learning new songs and actions in record time. Highly impressive! In our writing next week, we will be enjoying some poetry and we will be writing our own 'winter' acrostic poem. Perhaps the children could start thinking about some wintery words this weekend when you are out and about. The weather has certainly turned wintery for us with some crisp, frosty mornings. Thank you for sending children to school in warm coats. We are becoming masters at wriggling small fingers into gloves! In maths, we will be continuing to consolidate our learning with another look at number bonds to 20, one more and one less and addition and subtraction. We have recently re-assessed children for RWI phonics as part of the 6 week rolling programme. The children may find themselves in a new group with a different colour book soon. We are so pleased with the progress children are making. Well done to everyone, including you parents for continuing to support by hearing your child read at home. Thank you. Finally, we will be aiming to fit in a French lesson next week all about colours. I say aiming, as with Christmas dinner and all the other jobs to do, it is perhaps a little ambitious, but we'll aim high! We hope you all have a lovely weekend.

**Year 2** As we reach the final week of the term and the last month of one of the most unusual of years, we wanted to say how proud we are of all the children in Year 2. They have worked incredibly hard and shown great resilience in all their learning over the last two terms. We have been impressed with clear and concise instructional writing explaining how to make a snowman Christmas decoration this week, including features such as adverbs, time connectives and imperative verbs. The children have made a good start with their money learning in Maths. They have been able to name and order pounds, pence and notes and started to find totals of coins. As we finish our topic for the term, the children have been busy designing and decorating their memory boxes and are deciding what special memories to include. Next week we will be starting a week-long unit on poetry and the poems the children will write will be published onto scrolls, tied with ribbon and put into their memory box. Finally, next week the children will be making a photo frame for a class photo that they can also put in their memory box to remind them of the year 2020. Lastly, all the teachers and teaching assistants in Year 2 would like to wish all the children and their families a very merry, and safe, Christmas and we look forward to welcoming you back in 2021.

# More year group news...

**Year 3** We've had a fantastic term 2 and are all looking forward to the Christmas break! Before we reach the fun and festivities of Christmas we have a busy week of poetry learning where we will be writing our own poems based on 'The Sound Collector' by Roger McGough. We will also be bringing our 'Playlist' topic to a close by writing our own class song. Our week of creativity and performing will be topped off with the release of our Christmas performance on our school YouTube channel! In our Maths lessons, we will be continuing our multiplication learning focussing on the 3- and 4- times tables. Our learning will begin by focusing on practically building multiplications using cubes and using skip counting (3, 6, 9 etc) then we will move on to recall of the multiplication facts. Any practice that you are able to do with this at home will be invaluable.

**Year 4** This week we have enjoyed our class advent calendars, encouraging us to do good deeds before enjoying our rewards. It has been lovely watching the children taking this further and carrying out random acts of kindness in the playground and in the classroom; we are sure Santa is watching! In the last week of Term 2, we will be enjoying the build up to Christmas with our own performance of The Grinch and Jingle Bells, accompanied musically by the boomwhackers! You can watch this from Wednesday on YouTube (details of where to find it will follow). In literacy, we will be studying 'The Sound Collector' and writing our own poem based on experiences we collect using our own senses. Over the weekend, please encourage your child to take notice of sounds, smells, tastes and the feel of things they can touch so that they will have lots of ideas in class. In maths we will be multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 using place value to understand what happens to the digits. Finally, we will round off our topic learning with a class performance of our alternative version of 'Skip To My Lou' to share our understanding of sound.

**Year 5** Year 5 have been incredibly busy again this week! In English, the children have been writing a non-chronological report about an imaginary planet. They have used a range of sentence openers and ambitious vocabulary to write detailed paragraphs about their planet. The children will be publishing them next week and we will be sending a copy home for you to be the audience of their final written outcome. In Reading, we have started our final text of the term 'The Darkest Dark'. The children are so engaged in these sessions and participate willingly in discussions about what they have read. In Maths, we have been multiplying and dividing numbers by 10, 100 and 1000. Our Stargazers topic will draw to a close next week with the children being set a mission to make their own spaceship, which we will be launching into the air! Here are a few reminders before the end of term: Topic homework is due to be uploaded via Assignments by next Friday (18<sup>th</sup>), the children need a recyclable plastic bottle (no larger than 2l) and resources to decorate their spaceship in school from Monday and finally, if your child is able to play a musical instrument, please send us any videos of your child playing a Christmas Extravaganza!!!

Year 6 Our second assessment week has allowed the children to demonstrate what they are able to do and

we are now busy analysing the data to ensure teaching focuses on areas for development. The children have shown great interest in their scores and we will go through the papers with them next week to address any misconceptions. Along with the rest of Key Stage 2, we have enjoyed a range of individual challenges in our Games sessions this week and submitted our best scores to Miss Thomas. In our Topic sessions, we have learnt about biodiversity and written in role as Scott of the Antarctic, conveying - with vocabulary and sentence structure - his mixed emotions when he reached the South Pole only to discover he had been beaten to it. As we move into the final week of Term 2, we look forward to rounding off our Frozen Kingdom topic with a variety of activities, including planning a polar expedition. Please encourage your children to read regularly and quiz often to boost their AR word count. 6R are still in the lead with 5,657,965 words compared to 6WT's 5,096,629 and 6S's 4,516,143!
