Foundation Stage

Next week we will continue with our delicious fruit kebabs and writing instructions to make and eat them! The children are so excited about this activity and they have learnt a new word, 'patience'! We are lucky to be watching the Year 6 play on Monday morning and the children are looking forward to their first visit to their new classrooms on Wednesday. The children will also be taking part in a fun phonics assessment to get them ready for next year. We are noticing that the children are getting very tired and very hot as they tend to do at the end of a very busy year especially when the weather is kind to us. We are aiming to have lots of calm activities as we move towards the end of term. Please ensure that your child has a drink, cap or hat and has had sun block applied before school. Thank you for your continued support.

Year 1

Next week, the children in Y1 will be watching 'Grease' performed by the pupils in Year 6. We are looking forward to seeing this very famous film brought to life with perhaps enjoying some singing and dancing too! For literacy, the children will be focusing on non-fiction writing and creating their own African animal factfiles. They will be using a range of non-fiction books and drawing upon our recent, enjoyable visit to Paignton zoo to make them. In maths, the children will be revisiting finding missing numbers in number sentences and focusing on improving their subtraction calculation skills. On Wednesday, the children will be having their first Transition morning and are getting very excited to find out and meet their new teachers for Year 2. We will also be experiencing some African drumming, learning about bible stories in RE and making our own African inspired jewellery using dried pasta and poster paint. An enjoyable but busy week ahead!

Year 3

Next week in Maths, Year 3 will be using litres, millilitres and standard scales to explore capacity. In Computing they will be completing their Power Point presentations ready to share with each other. We have an exciting day of pottery and art planned where children will be designing and then making a Greek plate.

Year 6

Next week, we will be trying not to break a leg whilst performing our end of year production! Tickets have now gone home, but we do have some spaces left for the 2pm Thursday performance. Extra seats can be requested for this show. Please see the timetable below for siblings.

Year 4

Next week, we will be continuing to study The London Eye Mystery and will begin to plan our own narrative writing based on a missing person. In maths, we will be studying geometry, identifying and comparing angles and we will explore evaporation for science. In art, we will use our line drawings to produce a final outcome of a London landmark painted onto a pebble. Please remind your child to bring their pebble in by Monday so that they can be painted and varnished in readiness for hiding!

Year 5

In maths, Year 5 will continue to study the measure of time paying particular attention to journeys over hours and minutes and shorter intervals between minutes and seconds. They will also look carefully at thermometers to understand how temperatures can be changed and converted. In Literacy, we will continue to look at poetry on the theme of World War Two, with a focus on personification. Next week, we will also be sending out the final information about our World War II day where you will be invited into school for an afternoon of song, dance and cake! Thank you to all those parents that have replied to let us gauge numbers for the event.
