Year Group News

Foundation Stage We will go full on festive next week with an abundance of Christmas fun. Our focus text will be 'The Jolly Christmas Postman' and we will be making Christmas cards and writing letters to post. We will be trying our hand at wrapping presents of various shapes and sizes and talking about a range of 3D shapes as we work . Alongside this, we will be putting up and decorating our Christmas tree. Our Nativity will take place on Wednesday 11th December at 9.30am. We would like your child to come in festive mufti on this day and we will provide costumes for those who need them in the cast. Are you getting excited? We are!

Year 1 Year 1 loved performing their Mince Pie Sing-a-long this week. Thank you to all the parents/carers and families who were able to attend our performance! In Maths next week, we will be starting our new unit of learning on shape. We will be exploring 2D and 3D shapes and completing lots of practical activities to help us learn the names. In English, we will be continuing our letter writing by planning a letter to Father Christmas. What questions might you ask him? We are all very excited for our KS1 Christmas party on Thursday!

Year 2 We will be continuing our writing block on newspaper reporting, and will be researching and writing a newspaper article on the discoveries made by Mary Anning. We will be learning about number families and number facts in Maths. Our spelling focus rule for the week will be 'il', where we will be generating words with this spelling pattern and identifying and matching words with the spelling rule in them. We will be busy rehearsing for our big Christmas production to be held on Wednesday, 11th December. A letter has been sent home with updated information about ticket allocation and arrangements, please make sure that you have seen and read this and returned the slip to your child's teacher

Year 3 We had a fantastic time celebrating the lighting of the Goosewell Christmas tree this week and thank you for your support with this. It has been a very busy week in Year 3 we have completed our Non-chronological reports about our own dragon and even created some beautiful water colour art to go with them. Next week in English, we will begin looking at different poems linked to predators. Our reading focus will be comprehension skills where we focus on how to answer comprehension questions. In Maths, we will be focussing on practicing the 8 times table we will be representing our calculations using pictures and the bar model. We will also be dividing by 8.


Year 4 Thank you to everybody who joined us for the tree lighting on Monday and a special thank you to Mr Daniels for organising the lights. Next week in year 4, we will be combining English and our Playlist topic to look at different traditional songs and the different features of both songs and poetry. By the end of the week, we hope to have created our own for performance poetry about the ear! In Maths, we will be looking at multiplying and dividing by 12, factors and multiplying by 3 numbers.

Year 5 Year 5 have been incredibly busy this week! In English, the children have been writing a non-chronological report about an imaginary planet. They have used a range of sentence openers and ambitious vocabulary to write detailed paragraphs about their planet. What can your child tell you about the planet they created? In Maths, they have been calculating the perimeter of shapes and next week we will build on this by calculating area. Our reading sessions have initiated a lot of discussion about the similarities between 'How to Catch a Star' and 'The Way Back Home', both written by Oliver Jeffers. Look out for some of our book reviews, which will be available to view on our website soon. We are really looking forward to preparing for our Christmas Carol Concert, which you will have the opportunity to watch in the final week of term – more details about this will be coming home soon.

Year 6 Next week, in Maths, Year 6 will begin to look at position and direction. They will learn about reading and plotting co-ordinates on a 4 quadrant grid and will begin to look at translation and reflection within co-ordinate grids. In English, we will begin our poetry unit where we will study a variety of Haiku poems and build up to writing our own 'Frozen Kingdom' related Haiku poems. Our topic work will reach the innovation stage of our learning, where the children will be immersed in challenges related to our topic learning this term. Throughout the week, we will continue to prepare for our Christmas Carol Concert.
