# Year Group News

**Foundation Stage** An exciting week looms for us in Reception as we take the wonderful story of 'The Gruffalo's Child' by Julia Donaldson to inspire and drive our learning. Our teacher led activity will be simple sentence writing with the children choosing characters from the story to describe. We will look at the words 'the' and 'is' and will learn about starting with a capital letter and ending with a full stop. Our creativity will be tested as we make shadow puppets to retell the story and explore using black paper and white crayons and pencils to create monochrome , wintery scenes. We will also investigate and explore different animals and their environments and have a go at creating a camouflaged zone for a minibeast. In the home corner, we will be thinking about household rules so that we don't make the same mistakes that the Gruffalo's child did when she didn't listen to her Daddy!

**Year 1** Year 1 children will be continuing their writing based on 'Harry and his Bucketful of Dinosaurs'. They will be writing instructions on how to wash a dinosaur. In Maths, children will be learning how to subtract using practical objects. They will also be recording subtraction number sentences in their books. In D.T. we will be continuing to build our dinosaur worlds by adding some textured effects to the background. We are also very excited to start learning our songs for the 'Mince Pie Sing-a-long'. Don't forget Children in Need day on Friday!

**Year 3** Year 3 have enjoyed a busy week where we have begun looking at our new reading text 'Tell Me a Dragon'. The children have been amazed by the beautiful illustrations and enjoyed reading about different types of dragon. Over the next week, we will think about our own dragons and use different language features, such as similes, to describe them. During our Maths lessons, we have moved on to using the column method for addition, including calculations involving exchanging. Now we are moving on to using column subtraction. Our predators learning has involved looking at meat eating plants. We enjoyed watching clips of the plants eating small insects and even frogs! We thought about how they catch their prey and why they have adapted to other creatures. We are looking forward to raising money for Children in Need next week.

Next week's virtue is...... **Respect:** Due regard for the feelings, wishes or rights of others. **Year 4** After studying fables this week, all the children in Year 4 will be writing their own which we hope to share with some younger children in KS1. We need to make them as exciting as possible! For reading, we will continue to study 'The Pied Piper of Hamelin' and look at how we can infer a character's thoughts and feelings from their actions. In Maths we will be multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100 and solving problems involving these skills. During our Playlist topic, we will be sharing our musical preferences and examining how sounds are transferred through the ear to the brain.

Year 5 The fun has continued in Year 5 this week as we have been using pieces of fruit (and a pea) to create a virtual solar system on the playground. The children who held the fruits, which represented the planets, had to take a certain number of steps from the Sun in order to reflect their distance from the Sun in space. In Reading, we have started to read 'How to Catch a Star' by Oliver Jeffers and the children have empathised with the character's thoughts and feelings as well as predicted how they believe the character plans to catch a star. Year 5 are very excited about Children in Need next week because it is their first opportunity to organise their own stalls. The children have some fantastic ideas and we would appreciate it if you could ensure that your child is prepared to raise lots of money on Friday.

**Year 6** Next week, Year 6 will continue their fraction work where they will add and subtract fractions. In English, they will build up to writing their 'Rags to Riches' story by exploring the grammar features. In Science, we will look at food chains of animals in polar regions. It is Assessment Week next week for Year 6, so they will complete assessments in reading, maths, spelling, punctuation and grammar.
