**Year 5** We have reached the end of yet another fun-filled term in Year 5! Our project this term has allowed our children to learn about animal and plant life cycles and learn about the features and characteristics of land use in agricultural regions across the world. The texts that we have read throughout terms 3 and 4 have allowed us to develop the reading skills of vocabulary, inference, prediction, explaining, retrieval and summarising. We are really pleased with the progress that the children are making in Reading, which is evidenced by our spring term assessments. As a year group, our Accelerated Reader word count is currently 17,536,541! In English this week, we have been writing discussion texts about whether Jack should have sold the cow for beans or money. We have been impressed by the children's use of formal language, sentence openers and modal verbs to write well-written discussions. It was great to meet many of you at our parent meetings this week. We hope that your child takes on board all of the advice given in order for them to continue to progress well throughout the summer terms. 






# **Seeds for School Plymouth**
