Dear Parents and Carers

Incredibly, we have arrived at the end of another half-term and, as you will appreciate it has been a busy few weeks. Firstly, I would like to say a huge well done to all of the children who have continued to work so hard, this is especially true for our Year 6 and Year 2 children who completed their SATs. On a personal note, I was genuinely impressed with the level of calmness, resilience and confidence the children projected during this period and I am in no doubt they have done their best. I would also like to thank all of the staff who supported the children during the SATs process; a great team effort.

SATs aside there has been a real buzz throughout the school over the past few weeks with lots of children discussing how many Dojo points they had received and the reasons for their points. Remember, Dojos can be received for children demonstrating Visible Learning Behaviours as well as following the new school rules. We were very much hoping to finalise which Houses the children are in, however, the scale of the job and shortness of the term have meant that we will now do this on the first day back. I'm sure you'll understand that as we aim to ensure equality in the Houses combined with ensuring siblings remain in the same House it is a big job and we want to get it right!

I am pleased to let you know that Accelerated Reader (our new library system) is going from strength to strength. More quizzes are being undertaken by more children than ever before and it is a joy to watch the children go to the library independently to choose a new book, especially if they have done well in their quiz. Our next development with Accelerated Reader is to ensure all of the books in KS1 are scanned and put on the system and we aim to achieve this by the end of the summer term. I would also like to take this opportunity to ask for support from families by donating books that we can add to the system. All we ask is that the books are in good condition and that they are on the AR system. To do this, type the name of the book into this website https://www.arbookfind.co.uk/default.aspx and it will say if there is a quiz attached to that book. All donated books can be dropped off at the school office. We need lots! Thank you.

I would also like to thank you for your patience as the fence slowly starts to enclose the school. Speaking to the fence team we believe that phase 1 should be completed in around 4 weeks. Phase 2 will begin shortly afterwards where we will see the main playing field enclosed.

It is that time of year when we start to look ahead to the next academic year. I was hoping to be in a position to inform parents of which classes children will be in next year. Unfortunately, I am not in a position to do so but as soon as I can inform you I will – this is a priority for me. Part of planning for next year is also taking on-board the views of the children. Over this half term we have provided children with the opportunity to answer questions about the school. Answers were collated into different groups, Year 2, Year 3&4, Year 5&6. In total we had responses from 376 children. The results are on the school Facebook page. As you will see children generally have a positive view of the school but, as with any school, there are areas for us to reflect on and see how we can improve. I hope to run the same survey at another time to compare the results.

The final half term before we break up for the summer holiday is looking action packed including a visit to London, an outdoor activity week for the Year 6, the circus, a trip to Paignton zoo for Years 1 and 2 and the thing I'm most looking forward to is the performance of Grease by Year 6.

In the meantime, have a restful break and we look forward to welcoming you all back after half term and as always, please do not hesitate to speak to me if you have any questions.

Year Group News

Foundation Stage

After half term we are hoping that there will be some exciting news and our chicks will hatch. They have been kept warm in an incubator and we can't wait to meet them. In phonics we will continue using our sound knowledge to word build and write simple sentences. Our number task will be to create simple subtraction calculations using chicks and eggs. Outside the children will be hunting for mini-beasts and drawing what they find whilst in the shared area the children will be creating their own fluffy chicks and thinking of chick words to describe what they can see. Have a fantastic week and fingers crossed it will be lovely weather for getting out and about. Make sure that you



read regularly and it would be lovely to see what you are up to on Tapestry. Don't forget to have a go at the colouring competition from the PTA to win two tickets to the Happy Circus!

Year 1

After the half term break, the children in Year 1 will begin their new topic – Amazing Africa! The converting analogy years, months, we they would want to find out about this country. We will then focus on the African country of Kenya and make comparisons with the UK. We will continue to make a big push in phonics and revise all the sounds. A phonic revision booklet is coming home with your child today, so please make sure that you spend time over the week's holiday completing it – every little helps! In maths, the children will be counting forwards and backwards within 100.

Year 2

Next week in Year 2 we will be beginning our exciting topic about Africa! We will be studying African animals and writing fact files about them. We will be continuing to apply our understanding to reasoning problems in maths. In art, we are going to explore the use of colour, line and shape when creating African sunset pictures. We wish all our fabulous children a restful and fun-filled holiday and are so proud of how each and every one of them focused and showed their talents in their special booklets this month - well done all!

Year 3

After the term break, the children will be continuing their learning about time and duration. They will be completing a 'Big Write' in Literacy. In Science they will be finding out all about magnets. Finally, our new topic will be Ancient Greece and the year group are looking forward to experiencing a day of learning about the Greek Olympics and Greek food (date to be confirmed).

Year 4

After half term, we will be looking at time, converting analogue to digital and investigating years, months, weeks and days. To prepare for this, over the break please check that your child is able to read the time accurately on a digital and analogue clock. In literacy we will be reading two texts based on London and an information text about our capital city. In science, we will be looking at solids, liquids and gases and our geography topic will explore changes in London over the past 100 years. Your child will also bring home their London landmark model homework project this week.

Year 5

Next term, we will be focusing much of our work on our history topic: World War Two. In Literacy, we will begin by reading Michael Morpugo's Friend or Foe, discovering what life would have been like for a wartime evacuee, and predicting events throughout the story. In Maths, we will be testing the accuracy of the children's ability to measure and draw straight lines and angles. We will continue to focus on angles through the week but this time with an emphasis on calculating (and not measuring with protractors) the sizes of angles on a line and around a point. Sharp pencils and quick brains required!

Year 6

This week, we have been carrying out our own 'Goosewell Has Talent' auditions and searching for the next stars of the show. We have roles for everyone including singing, dancing, technical support and prop design. We have announced the main roles, so the children have the opportunity to digest the script over Half Term. A reminder that swimming starts after half term on Monday 3rd June. Please ensure that your child has handed in their permission slip and comes to school on the first day back with kit, towel, hat and googles! We leave just after 9am.




